Introduction

Alaska's current population age 65 and older is almost 100,144, an increase of around 40 percent in the past 10 years. This represents the fastest per capita growth rate of seniors in the nation, and that explosive growth is projected to continue for the next two decades. Indeed, Alaska's senior population continues to grow even while the state's overall population has declined in recent years.

This directory is an effort to keep up with the businesses and agencies serving this older population. The OPAG Directory for Older Alaskans has a long history, going back more than 30 years to its roots as a stapled pamphlet and evolving to the durable book it is today.

Hints for using this directory

Finding listings

Listings are grouped by city, and the cities are grouped by region. This allows one to browse their geographical area as well as look in hub cities. Some organizations may offer services in your city although they may be listed under another.

The *Listings by Region/City* section starts on page 21, where you will find a table of contents for that section. A quick reference section for selected U.S. and Alaska government offices starts on page 9.

In addition, all listings are indexed alphabetically in the back of the directory starting on page 148.

Service areas

Within the listing section some organizations are shown as offering services *statewide* or *regionally*. If no service area is specified, the organization offers services *locally*.

Statewide and regional organizations usually use offices in different cities to cover their area of service, so an office in a particular city may only serve part of the organization's area.

Local organizations often serve neighboring areas. For instance a Fairbanksbased agency might offer services in North Pole, Ester and Fox, or a Palmer service might be available in Wasilla and Chickaloon. So if you don't find what you are looking for under your city, try some nearby cities, especially larger ones.

Phone numbers

Unless otherwise noted, all phone numbers use the 907 area code. Most locations now require you to use the area code even in your local area. Phone numbers with area code 800, 833, 844, 855, 866, 877, and 888 are all toll-free numbers, even if it is not stated so explicitly.

Addresses

We've saved space by generally not including the city and state in the address. If they are not given, you can assume that the city is the same as the city heading of the listing and the state is Alaska (AK).

If two lines of address are given, such as: 354 Riverside Dr PO Box 168

The upper one is the physical address and the lower the mailing address. The Zip code is the one for the mailing address.

TESTING

Tests and results take time. How long depends on the clinic.



TAKE CARE OF YOU

•Do things you enjoy like carving, arts and crafts, gardening, or explore new hobbies.

- Treat yourself to healthy foods and get enough rest. Try a new recipe.
- •Find new ways to connect with friends and family like Face Time apps, weekly calls, or write a letter.
- Take care of your body. Talk with your doctor. Take your vitamins and prescribed medications.
- •Get out and move, go fishing, or for a walk. Play with a pet.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water or 60% or higher alcohol wash.

SAFE ACTIVITIES

NON-VACCINATED

•Need to wear a mask in public, stay apart by 6 feet, and wash hands often.

• Risk levels are lowest when doing outside activities like

going for a walk, berry picking, or fishing

•Risk levels increase when around other people in groups like parties or musical concerts. The risk is highest for inside activities.

VACCINATED PERSON

• If you are fully vaccinated, you can do the activities that you did before the pandemic.

•*Fully vaccinated people can do activities without wearing a mask or staying apart, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance.

*Persons with underlying medical conditions could still be at risk for infections even when vaccinated. If you live with elders or someone with certain underlying medical conditions, then you and all family members should take extra precautions to minimize risk by talking to the doctor, continuing to wear a mask and washing your hands often.

Parks and Public Lands — The Interagency Senior Pass is available to U.S. citizens or permanent residents 62+ for a one-time \$10 fee. The pass gives free admission and/or large discounts in services at National Forest Service, Park Service, BLM, and Fish and Wildlife sites nationwide.

#### State of Alaska

Alaska Legal Services Corporation — Free legal assistance on civil matters for those 60+.

Marine Highway System — Discounts on fares for those 65+ on all sailings within Alaska. Discounts are automatic when booking.

Motor Vehicles, Division of — Free registration of one noncommercial vehicle for residents 65+. Register in person first time.

Pioneer Homes — Possibility of living in one of the state's renown homes for those 65+ who have been residents for 12 consecutive months as of date of application.

Fish and Game, Department of — Free fishing and hunting licenses available to those 60+ who have been residents for at least one year.

University of Alaska — Allows permanent residents 65+ to take classes for free in the UA system on a space-available basis.

#### Local

Property Tax Exemption — All local governments in Alaska exempt some portion of an owner-occupied home's assessed value for seniors.

Sales Tax Exemption — Some communities offer seniors an exemption from local sales tax on some or all purchases, or a rebate to cover the tax.

Utility discounts — Some communities offer seniors discounts on local utility fees.

Other free or reduced services — Common breaks are for bus service, libraries, recreational facilities, community schools, etc.
